- This can range from using sticky pad notes for text support to sophisticated text to speech programs.

- ITRT's are great!
- What is an ITRT? You ask???
- An Instructional Technology Resource Teacher
- The 2005 Virginia General Assembly amended the Standards of Quality to require school boards to employ one instructional technology resource teacher (ITRT) per 1,000 students
- Find out who your ITRT is, and what they can offer to you and your students.
- They know the latest technology and can assist you to implement it in your classroom. Many ITRT's will come to you for personal training.


# People Resources - What's Local



  - Provide supplemental learning materials


#### What's Next?

   A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words




#### Videos




